Appin Mine	May 2026	22/05/2026	A community member contacted a staff member directly alleging that a GM <sup>3</sup> team entered their property to collect data from Navigation Creek at Finns Road, Menangle without authorisation.	The Community Team confirmed that environmental field personnel were conducting baseline water monitoring at the Navigation Creek monitoring location accessed via the public road reserve. During the inspection, team members incorrectly accessed a section of private property after misunderstanding the property boundary arrangements in the area. The Environmental Team has acknowledged the issue and confirmed that the access method has been clarified with all personnel to ensure future inspections remain within the approved public access area. Additional communication will also be provided to relevant crews and contractors regarding the correct access arrangements for this monitoring location. The landholder was advised of the investigation outcome and confirmed they were satisfied with the response provided.
Appin Mine Ventilation and Access Project	April 2026	26/04/2026	A community member contacted a staff member directly reporting disturbance from blast-related noise and vibration during night-time hours, including early morning events.	The Project Team reviewed the reported times against operational activities, confirming that some events coincided with shaft blasting. Monitoring data confirmed that all blasting was conducted within approved noise, overpressure and vibration limits. The Community Team met with the complainant to discuss the findings and potential next steps. The complainant agreed to engage with a noise consultant to consider options for additional verification monitoring and further assessment at the residence. Ongoing engagement will continue. The complainant was satisfied with the agreed next steps. Update (June): The complainant had indicated that no more blasting was being noticed and did not want the additional monitoring offered.

The complainant reported an odour and requested an update on the progress of the remediation works.</p>	<p>The caller was advised that remediation works are being progressed to address the source of the discharge, with activities ongoing in accordance with site conditions. It was confirmed that daily monitoring of gas levels, odour and site conditions is being undertaken, including on weekends, to inform response actions. The site continues to operate under active environmental and safety controls. Efforts are being made to minimise odour impacts where practicable, and the matter is being managed in coordination with relevant teams and agencies. The caller was provided with an update on current progress and offered ongoing updates as works continue. The complainant was satisfied with the response.</p>

Regular monitoring of water levels and water quality is being undertaken, with results reviewed to inform ongoing management. A meeting has been held with the landholder to discuss the situation, outline current controls, and address property-specific concerns. Monitoring and mitigation measures will continue, and the caller has been offered ongoing updates as further information becomes available. The complainant was satisfied with the response.</p>

No specific details were provided, including the vehicle description, time of the incident, or characteristics of the alleged behaviour.	The Community Team has liaised with the contracting company; however, due to insufficient information, it was not possible to attribute the complaint to a specific driver or employee. The matter has been addressed with the relevant contracting reinforcing the Driver Code of Conduct. No response could be issued to the complainant as it was an anonymous complaint.
Logistics	March 2026	27/03/2026	A community member emailed the Community mailbox reporting damage to their vehicle windscreen, allegedly caused by a rock from a truck associated with Appin Mine operations travelling along Appin Road. The incident was reported to have occurred on 3 March 2026 at approximately 9:28 am, with the complaint submitted on 27 March 2026.	The Community Team acknowledged receipt of the complaint and advised the complainant that the matter is under review. Following confirmation from Operations on 2 April 2026 that the truck may be associated with our operations, the complainant was advised that claims of this nature are managed directly by the Principal Contractor. The complainant was provided with the appropriate contact details to lodge their claim for formal assessment and response.

Appin Mine Ventilation and Access Project	January 2026	13/01/2026	A community member contacted a staff member directly, reporting experiences of “rumbling” and vibration within their residence over the preceding two weeks. Multiple dates and times were provided, and the reported impacts included disturbance to a household pet.	An investigation was undertaken to assess the reported times against operational activities. A review of blasting records confirmed that most of the reported dates and times coincided with shaft blasting. Detailed analysis of vibration and noise monitoring data confirmed that all blasting activities were conducted in compliance with approved limits. Following further engagement, the community member advised that they have not noticed any additional blast-related disturbance in the past two weeks. On this basis, no further investigation or additional monitoring is proposed at this time, with the matter to remain under observation should future concerns be raised. The complainant was satisfied with the outcome.

The complainant was advised that the matter is best managed directly by the contractor company and was requested to lodge a formal claim through their claims process (as the alleged incident occurred on a public road). The Community Team also forwarded the complaint details directly to the contractor. The response was issued to the community member via email. No response has been received to date.
Appin Mine Ventilation and Access Project	December 2025	1/12/2025	A community member called the Community Call Line at 9:51 am alleging damage to their vehicle caused by dust from stockpiles associated with the Ventilation and Access Project. The complainant advised the incident occurred during windy conditions on Wednesday, 26 October at approximately 12:10 pm while travelling along Menangle Road. The complainant also informed the Environment Protection Authority (EPA).	The Community Team contacted the complainant to request additional information to assist with the investigation. The site reviewed all available information, including monitoring data, footage, site imagery, site logs, and local weather records. Monitoring results confirmed compliance with regulatory requirements, and no evidence was identified to indicate that dust or site conditions associated with site activities contributed to the alleged vehicle damage. On this basis, the claim was not accepted. The outcome was communicated to the complainant, who expressed dissatisfaction. GM <sup>3</sup> fully cooperated with the EPA investigation and supplied all information requested.

A review of dust monitors at Appin East confirmed particulate matter levels were well below compliance limits and consistent with local and regional air quality trends (data published on the company website). Truck haulage volumes were assessed and found to be consistent, with no increase in traffic. An inspection of the haul road was undertaken and, as a precaution, a street sweeper was deployed. Ongoing monitoring of the road will continue. The landholder was advised accordingly with a meeting undertaken to discuss further. The complainant was satisfied with outcomes discussed following the meeting.
Appin West – Pit Top	September 2025	16/09/2025	A community member called the Community Call Line at 11:28 am to report a constant noise, ongoing for the past two days, coming from the direction of the Appin Mine West Pit Top.	The Community Team contacted the complainant for further details. An investigation at Wilton confirmed noise west of the Mine and also noted nearby housing construction. Operations identified a recirculation valve associated with a pump at the Appin West Gas Drainage Plant as a potential source and isolated it. The complainant later confirmed the noise had ceased. Operations will notify the Community Team prior to any future use of the pump/valve to enable additional noise mitigation if required. The complainant was satisfied with the outcome.

A review of contractor activity, vehicle movements, and load security checks found no direct evidence to substantiate the claim. Regular road sweeping was confirmed as in place, and a safety reminder was issued to drivers. The complainant accepted GM <sup>3</sup> 's response while continuing to follow up with the Principal Contractor regarding the claim.

Sound panels were installed around the site to help mitigate noise, prevent perceived odour issues and maintain the privacy of the landholder. The community member was satisfied with the actions.

They attempted to dial the publicly displayed phone numbers of the Principal Contractor, however after several attempts, no answer was received.	The Community Team contacted the Community Member to explain that the road can't be opened until the Wollondilly Shire Council have signed off on the work. The displayed phone numbers from the Principal Contractor will be removed after the completion of the roadworks. On the 30 March 2023, the Community Team called the complainant to advise that Menangle Road was now opened to the public. He was satisfied with the outcome but raised concerns about upgrading other roads in the area.

A review of the real-time air quality monitors showed elevated particulate matter during a 15-min average at the time of the storm, however no exceedance of the 24-hour criteria - the parameter the Project is measured against. When activities are occurring, 3-4 water carts continuously operate to reduce dust. Additional dust mitigation during periods of no activity will be implemented, including the application of additional soil binding agents into the water carts prior to end of shift and weekends. The resident was advised of the outcome.</p>
